It is important to recognize that psychoanalysis, or what Joseph Breuer's patient Anna O, termed 'Talking Cure', actually comprises of numerous elements that are not speech-based. In his talk, Dr. Akhtar will speak about the five nonverbal communications in the session that are important for delving into the unconscious. The five realms of nonverbal communications, broadly classified by him are as follows:

- (a) Psychostructural
- (b) Formal
- (c) Patient-originated
- (d) Analyst- originated
- (e) Simultaneously occurring.

Dr Akhtar will attend to awareness of these nonverbal elements and facilitate understanding about their theoretical origins, manifestations, use, and consequences, which greatly enrich psychoanalytic clinical work.

Salman Akhtar, MD, is Professor of Psychiatry at Jefferson Medical College and a Training and Supervising Analyst at the Psychoanalytic Center of Philadelphia. He has served on the editorial boards of the IJP, the Journal of the Am. Psychoanalytic Assoc. & the Psychoanalytic Quarterly, has been Film Review Editor for the IJP and is currently serving as the Book Review Editor for the Int. Journal of Applied Psychoanalytic Studies. He has written 99 books and more than 400 publications with translations into many languages.

Dr. Akhtar is a renowned and popular speaker, especially amongst his students. He is a recipient of many prestigious awards like the Columbia University's Robert Liebert Award for Distinguished Contributions to Applied Psychoanalysis (2004) and the Sigourney Award (2012) for distinguished contributions to psychoanalysis. He also has a passion for poetry and has published 11 collections of poetry and is serving as a Scholar-in-Residence at the Inter-Act Theatre Co. in Philadelphia.
